



Fruit Tree Simple Spray Schedule

Youngs Simple Spray Schedule includes the minimum needed to keep fruit trees healthy.

It is designed to be very do-able for the home gardener.

Depending on individual circumstances, additional spray sessions may be required.

Home gardeners can choose from either organic or synthetic Bonide spray options.

Fruits with Pits (Peaches, Apricots, Plums, Cherries, Nectarines)

WHEN	SPRAY	AMOUNT	INSECT/DISEASE
February When trees are dormant	<i>All Seasons Oil (Org)</i> (Do not combine with copper spray)	5 Tbsp/gal	Kills overwintering insects (scale, mites, aphids, codling moth, whitefly, etc.).
March When leaf buds start to swell before they open	<i>Liquid Copper (Org)</i> OR <i>Bonide Fung-onil (Syn)</i>	2 Tbsp/gal 1 tsp/gal	Kills bacterial blights, leaf curl, and other fungal diseases. Spray the ground and branches thoroughly.
10 days later	<i>Liquid Copper (Org)</i> OR <i>Bonide Fung-onil (Syn)</i>	2 Tbsp/gal 1 tsp/gal	
April	<i>Cpt Jack Fruit Tree Spray (Org)</i> OR <i>Fruit Tree Spray (Syn)</i>	3 Tbsp/gal 2.5 Tbsp/gal	Keeps insects from attacking new fruit, prevents brown rot and blights.
June	<i>Cpt Jack Fruit Tree Spray (Org)</i> OR <i>Fruit Tree Spray (Syn)</i>	3 Tbsp/gal 2.5 Tbsp/gal

Fruit with Seeds (Apples, Pears, Asian Pears)

APPLES

WHEN	SPRAY	AMOUNT	INSECT/DISEASE
January / February When trees are dormant - no leaves or buds	<i>All Seasons Oil (Org)</i>	5 Tbsp/gal	Kills scab and over-wintering insects.
April	<i>Cpt Jack Fruit Tree Spray (Org)</i> OR	3 Tbsp/gal	Kills apple maggots, codling moth & other fruit damaging insects; rust, scab, mildew & assorted fruit rots. Spray the leaves and fruit thoroughly.
	<i>Fruit Tree Spray (Syn)</i>	2.5 Tbsp/gal	
June	<i>Cpt Jack Fruit Tree Spray (Org)</i> OR	3 Tbsp/gal	Kills apple maggots, codling moth & other fruit damaging insects; rust, scab, mildew & assorted fruit rots. Spray the leaves and fruit thoroughly.
	<i>Fruit Tree Spray (Syn)</i>	2.5 Tbsp/gal	

PEARS and ASIAN PEARS

WHEN	SPRAY & AMOUNT		INSECT/DISEASE
January / February When trees are dormant - no leaves or buds	<i>All Seasons Oil (Org)</i>	5 Tbsp/gal	Kills over-wintering insects.
